Curricula	(plural form) groups of subjects / courses studied in school, college, university, etc.

Deem	to judge a situation as being in a certain way
Dichotomy	the difference between two opposite things

Lingua franca	a language used between a groups that have another language inside their groups

Maritime	related to sea and coastal activities or near the sea or coast

Project Steering Committee	the group that drives the project and constantly monitors its progress; the Project Steering Committee is the key body to oversee the week-to-week progress of the project. It owns the business case.
Propensity	a tendency towards a bad behavior

Retailer	a business, shop or person that sells goods to the public
Romance language	language developed from Latin

Satin	a type of cloth or surface that is smooth and shiny on one side, but not on the other
Stakeholder	a person or group that owns or is part of a business, organization or project
Stakeholder Advisory Group	external bodies from industry, public sector and NGO that will provide advice and feedbacks on key issues related to the progress of the project and validate its main results assuring end user orientation of the NMU offer.
Statistical hypothesis testing (tests of significance)	method for making a statistical decision
Summer courses	courses designed to provide educational opportunities to students during the summer months when schools traditionally have the summer break or summer vacation
Supply chain	a well organized system that follows the goods in their road from the supplier to the customer

Telematics	wireless communications network supporting remote applications such as utility meter reading from a distance, vehicle location, monitoring, and others.
Tender	a formal or written offer for doing a job or supplying goods for an agreed price
